


Some of the year 7s have brought me some fabulous work that they have completed over the summer holidays.

Black History Month is an annual celebration observed in October in the United Kingdom, dedicated to recognising and honouring the contributions, achievements, and history of Black individuals and communities. At Hydesville Tower, we are committed to enriching our students' understanding of this significant cultural month through a variety of engaging activities.

This year's theme, #ReclaimingNarratives, encourages pupils to explore and reinterpret stories from the Black community, fostering a deeper understanding and appreciation of diverse perspectives. Students will engage in an array of activities across all subjects, integrating themes of Black history into their learning journey. Year 8 pupils have already begun studying the Civil Rights Movement as part of their curriculum and throughout October all senior pupils will be welcome to attend a screening of the inspiring film Hidden Figures, which highlights the pivotal roles of Black women in NASA during the Space Race, prompting discussions about representation and achievement.

Additionally, a school-wide competition will challenge students to creatively showcase their understanding of Black history through art, poetry, or presentations. We urge all pupils to immerse themselves in these enriching experiences, thereby reinforcing our commitment to inclusivity and respect for all cultures at Hydesville Tower.
