



In this exciting make-believe world, they let their imaginations run wild, exploring various role-play scenarios.



WEEKLY ROUND UP NURSERY






Our little Nursery artists have been busy creating vibrant finger-painted rainbows



It was a brilliant opportunity to see the sport at its highest level, and no doubt our pupils left with a renewed sense of ambition (and maybe a few ideas for their next match in PE!).











This term, our Year 7 pupils have been delving into the complexities of friendships, identity and personal safety.

Through thoughtful discussions and activities, they've explored what it means to form and maintain meaningful, supportive relationships, while also learning to recognise and avoid toxic ones.



Bullying

Why is bullying happening?

Bullying can happen by accident. It might start as a friendly joke at first but can lead to hurtful and mean comments and the person doing it might not even realise.

However, most bullying happens on purpose and reasons could be that the bully might just want to be popular and look cool in front of their friends. Or perhaps the bully has been targeted on in the past and thinks its ok to make fun of people.



How to identify if someone is being bullied and what to do

A person being bullied may be:

- · Repeatedly laughed at or called names
- Physically bullied e.g. hit, slapped, poked, kicked, or deliberately hurt
- . Mean rumours spread about them
- Belongings broken or stolen on purpose
 And more.

If you do see anything like this happening or something that doesn't seem right, then you must tell a trusted adult or if in school tell a teacher.

Statistics

- . 1 out of 5 children has been bullied at some point
- Every 7 seconds a child is bullied
- Up to 43% of students say they have experienced harassment online
- . 40% of children who are bullied deal with it every week

A key part of their learning has been distinguishing between friendly banter and harmful behaviour.

With plenty of lively debate (and a few "aha!" moments), pupils have reflected on the importance of respect in every interaction, whether in person or online.

Bringing their learning to life, they've designed a powerful anti-bullying campaign to raise awareness within our school community.

Their posters serve as a bold reminder of the importance of kindness, inclusion, and empathy - values that make our school a place where everyone can thrive.









Year 9 Pupils Prepare for Expedition at Cannock Chase

On Friday, 14th March, a group of Year 9 pupils ventured to Cannock Chase for a training day ahead of their expedition in June.



Looking ahead, our Language Leaders are now delving into Easter traditions in France.




They are busy planning engaging lessons, packed with fun activities, which they will team-teach to our Year 7 pupils.

As some pupils complete final coursework elements this term, we wish them every success in their upcoming exams and look forward to celebrating their well-earned results.



Yasin M - nominated by Mrs Chattha for going above and beyond in Science, particularly excelling in his recent assessments.


