












WEEKLY ROUND U NURSERY

It was a fantastic way to nurture a love for reading and inspire a lifelong passion for books from an early age!














Over the past week, our Reception children have been exploring how to compare and order objects based on length and height.

As you can see, we took our own car and driver to help us practise.



Their creativity and meticulous attention to detail truly shine through in each piece—fantastic work, both of you! Keep up the great effort!




WEEKLY ROUND UP PREP






Gursimran B (Y7) description of her piece:

Dear Parents,

Thank you for attending our recent Maths and Literacy Workshop! Our goal was to help you better understand how we teach these subjects and equip you with strategies to support your child's learning at home.

Why This Workshop?

Homework can be challenging with evolving teaching methods. We aimed to bridge any "method conflict" by sharing insights into the National Curriculum and classroom approaches. A key takeaway was fostering a growth mindset—the power of yet—to encourage perseverance in learning.

What We Covered:

 Maths: Key number facts, mental and written calculation strategies, and problem-solving skills. We introduced methods like Counting On/Back, Jump Strategy, and Bridging to 10, and shared useful online resources like Corbettmaths.co.uk and the Hydesville Maths Website.

 Literacy: The importance of precise vocabulary, exam expectations, and speaking skills. We discussed Accelerated Reader and our partnerships with ESU, ISA, and ESB to enhance verbal communication

We also introduced fun home-learning resources, including Fraction Action Snap and Mathopoly, to make learning interactive. Remember, your attitude towards maths and literacy has a significant impact on your child's perception. By being positive, pointing out the relevance of these subjects in everyday life, and praising effort over innate talent, you can help them develop confidence and a love for learning. Thank you to all who attended. We value your partnership in your child's education!






WEEKLY ROUND UF SENIOR

This early exposure to realworld work environments also helps them prepare for the post-16 application process, providing valuable insights into career options and further education pathways.


By aligning these opportunities with their studies, we ensure our pupils are ready to take the next step with confidence.


