

Young Voice pupils joined 2000 schools worldwide to celebrate Bob Marley's 80th birthday.










This week, Musical theatre club got creative with puppetry and drama!

It was a fantastic week of imagination, storytelling, and teamwork! 🤧 🥻








YEAR 3










PREP DIGITAL CHAMPIONS





Children's Mental Health Week: Know Yourself, Grow Yourself

Children's Mental Health Week is a vital annual event dedicated to raising awareness about the importance of mental well-being in children and young people. It encourages open conversations about emotions, mental health challenges, and the role of supportive environments in fostering resilience.

This year's theme, Know Yourself, Grow Yourself, highlights the importance of self-awareness—understanding what makes us who we are, our strengths, fears, dreams, and emotions. By recognizing and expressing our feelings, we build resilience and personal growth.

To kick off the week, 7S led an inspiring assembly introducing the theme and setting the tone for meaningful discussions ahead in form time.

TIPS FOR FAMILIES





Just like Riley, encourage your older children and young people to express their emotions and thoughts through journalling. It can be less confronting than speaking out loud and is a helpful way to process what is going on.

(2) Make space for reflection

When children and young people reflect on their different emotions, it can help them better understand themselves and what they need.

Go for a walk, drive, or try some mindful colouring or baking together.

3 Be visual

Use imagery, such as emojis or flashcards to help children and young people recognise and label their feelings.

Practice mindfulness

Try mindful activities, and quiet family time, to enjoy being in the present moment. This can help children and young people be aware of their thoughts and emotions and learn a useful new coping technique.

Communicate

Feedback is crucial for helping us see our blind spots and gain greater insight. Children and young people are no different. Creating safe and supportive ways to share your own experience with your child can help them understand themselves and their impact on the world around them.





Safer Internet Day: 'Too good to be true? Protecting yourself and others from scams online'

On Safer Internet Day, pupils in Years 7-11 had the opportunity to take part in an insightful webinar organised by Cognita, where they joined over 20 schools from across the UK. The session was led by AI expert and former police officer, Henry Platten, who shared his expertise on the ever-evolving role of AI in our digital lives.

Henry explained how AI is not only revolutionising industries but is also being used in scams that target unsuspecting individuals. Pupils were introduced to practical strategies to safeguard themselves online using the "ABC" rule: Assume nothing, Believe nothing, Confirm everything. This simple yet effective approach helps pupils stay vigilant and make informed decisions in an increasingly complex digital landscape.

It was an invaluable session that empowered pupils to stay safe while navigating the internet, equipping them with the knowledge to spot online threats and defend their personal information. Here's to building a safer, smarter digital future!


